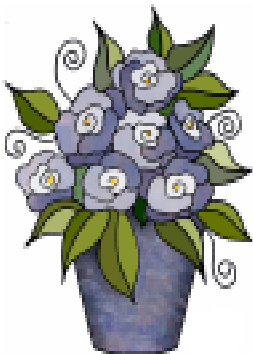

Downtown Beautification

Many thanks to village resident, Karen Verne, for her continued dedication and hard work in planting the flowers in the Cedar Street park and in the planters along Main Street. Karen has volunteered countless hours to this project to ensure it's success and it is appreciated!

Why Are the Planters So Big?

We've been asked why the planters along Main Street are so large. This size was selected to ensure visibility, even with vehicles parked along the street. The impression visitors take away from a community is often shaped by their experience driving through it. 2018 Landfill & Yard Waste Pickup Schedule

Note: Items must be curbside no later than 8:00 am the day of pickup. After a street has been picked up the DPW will not return to pick up items that are put out after they've been through.

Landfill: includes old furniture, rugs, linoleum and open and dried paint cans. **NO METAL!** **The following will not be picked up:** tires, household chemicals, pesticides, herbicides, etc., construction debris, paint cans that are not open, computers, monitors, or televisions.

No metal with landfill items.

Rate schedule: 1st bucket \$0; 2nd bucket \$10; additional buckets \$20 (bucket refers to full backhoe bucket).

Yard Waste: includes leaves, branches, garden plants and brush (cut 4' length). Uncut branches and brush will **NOT** be picked up.

Metal: includes refrigerators, air conditioners, water heaters, lawn mowers, and scrap metal. No paint cans (put those out on landfill day).

OPEN BURNING IS PROHIBITED WITHIN THE VILLAGE WITHOUT A PERMIT

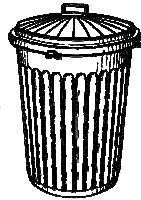
If you have an outdoor 'fire pit' please contact the Code Enforcement Officer for a permit application. **You must apply for a permit each year.**

**VILLAGE RESIDENTS PLEASE NOTE:
REMINDER REGARDING PLACEMENT &
REMOVAL OF GARBAGE/RECYCLING/
LANDFILL/YARD WASTE TO CURB**

Pursuant to the Code of the Village of Morrisville:

- Curbside garbage/trash/recyclables (which includes landfill and yard waste) shall not be placed at the curb **more than 18 hours prior to pickup**
- **Trash cans and materials not picked up shall not be left curbside more than 24 hours after the designated pickup**
- Any garbage, trash, recyclables or other items put out and/or left out in violation of these provisions may be collected by the Village and the property owner invoiced for the cost of pickup along with an additional administrative fee.

If you notice a property not in compliance, please notify the Village Office. Let's work together to keep our village attractive!



Considering Renovations to Your Home?

Property owners are encouraged to contact the Code Enforcement Officer prior to beginning any construction project to determine if permits are required.

Notice a street light that's out?

If you notice a street light that's not working properly (out, flickering, or cycling on and off) please report this to the Village Office.

**Village Taxes will be collected until
July 2 without penalty.**

After July 2, a fee of five per centum will be charged and an additional one per centum per month thereafter.

Permit Required to Solicit Within the Village

Residents should be aware of village ordinances which provide regulation and permit procedures for door-to-door solicitors. All door-to-door solicitors must have a permit issued by the Village, which is required to be visibly displayed.

Thinking About Becoming a Landlord?

To rent any property or part of it as a residence or dwelling, the owner must first obtain a certificate of compliance issued by the Code Enforcement Officer of the Village of Morrisville. Compliance with the requirements of Chapter 143 (Rental Property) and Chapter 180 (Zoning) of the Code of the Village of Morrisville is required. Failure to comply with any provision of these chapters is punishable by a fine.
